

"The Great Benevolence"

The Gardena Buddhist Church (GBC) is quickly approaching its centennial year. There are many wonderful and inspirational stories that are a part of the temple's legacy. Of course, that we

have wonderful stories probably goes without saying. Without these kinds of stories it is highly unlikely that the temple would have survived this long. Having said that, there are also stories that everyone knows—like the temple being burned to the ground and the support that followed—and there are stories that only one or two people know. I would like to share a story that is likely one that, until now, only I know. This is a story that occurred during GBC's 95th Anniversary Service.

I was reminded of this story when putting up the uchishiki for our last Goshoki Hoonko Service. At the time of the occurrence, Rev. John Doami¹ was helping us set up for the 95th Year Anniversary Service. As part of the setup, we naturally had flowers prepared for our altar. The flower vases that we use have detachable ears

1 Rev. John Doami served at the Gardena Buddhist Church from 1969-1970 that Rev. Doami was unfamiliar with. Because of this, Sensei accidentally knocked off one of the ears. The ear fell off the vase and landed hard on one of the end piece of the maejoku ("front table." This is the large table that sits closest to the gejin, or the area where everyone sits). Because of how hard and heavy the ear of the flower vase is, it left a deep mark on the end piece. At the time of the incident, Rev. Doami apologized profusely. We consoled Rev. Doami by informing him that we were probably going to repair all of our altar pieces soon, and that the mark left on the table is not really visible unless you walked right beside the table. I don't know how convinced Rev. Doami was with this explanation, but we all put the incident aside in order to get ready for and successfully conduct the temple's 95th Year Anniversary Service.

Now, as in the other day, I am reminded of Rev. Doami whenever I think of what happened that day. Although it is sad to think that Rev. Doami is no longer physically with us, on the other hand I am also filled with a sense of deep appreciation for having been able to spend time with Rev. Doami. Remembering Rev. Doami has also helped to remind me about how many other wonderful people and teachers have graced the Gardena Buddhist Church, as well (Continued on page 2)

as my own life. It also reminds me to look at the image of Amida Buddha, Shinran Shonin, Rennyo Shonin, Shotoku Taishi, and the Shichi Koso ("Seven Exalted Priests"). Seeing these images reminds me of how many causes and conditions, people and events have been a part of helping me to hear the Nenbutsu teaching today. Despite all the things that I have and can complain about, seeing the blemish on the table has, paradoxically, reminded me of all the things I can and need to be grateful for.

This transformative experience, of being able to feel gratitude even for something that may at first have seemed "negative," is, I think, best expressed in the following poems written by Shinran Shonin. The first is found in the collection titled the Kousou Wasan ("Hymns of the Pure Land Masters"), and the second from the collection titled the Shouzoumatsu Wasan ("Hymns of the Dharma Ages"). The second poem is probably the most widely known of all of Shinran Shonin's poems. Its popularity can be attested by the fact that it has been given its own title by Jodo Shinshu Buddhists. This poem has come to be known as the Ondokusan.²

2 Although there is no translation for Ondokusan available in the Collected Works of Shinran (CWS), given how the CWS has translated other passages, Ondokusan might be translated as "Hymn on (the Great) Benevolence." Of those who encounter the power of the Primal Vow,

Not one passes by in vain;

They are filled with the treasure ocean of virtues,

The defiled waters of their blind passions not separated from it.

(CWS, p. 364)

Such is the benevolence of Amida's great compassion,

That we must strive to return it, even to the breaking of our bodies;

Such is the benevolence of the masters and true teachers,

That we must endeavor to repay it, even to our bones becoming dust.

(CWS, p. 412)

Our next parent meeting will be on February 2nd. We hope to see everyone there!






